COLONEL JODINE (JODI) K. TOOKE

Col Jodine K. Tooke leads the effort to provide a common information technology infrastructure to support global warfighting and business systems through Air Force enterprise-centric acquisition, modernization, operations and maintenance. Partnering closely with the Air Force Communications Agency and Major Command communicators, she guides establishment and sustainment of the Air Force's cyberspace domain.

She studied electrical engineering and graduated as a distinguished graduate from the Air Force Reserve Office Training Corps at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. After graduation and commissioning, she served in a number of technical positions requiring expertise in electromagnetic compatibility, base infrastructure planning, and satellite systems. She helped build the Systems Telecommunications Engineering Management program in 1990, and worked the resource apportionment for the initial Milstar satellite in 1994.

During her assignment to the Air Force Personnel Center, Col Tooke developed a comprehensive Enhanced Follow-on/Homebasing program to match military members returning from remote assignments with desired follow-on assignment locations. In 1999 she spearheaded the 12th Flying Training Wing's Y2K risk assessment and mission impact abatement.

During her first assignment to the Pentagon on the Air Staff in 2000, Col Tooke coordinated the needs of principle users of the various airborne communication systems. She later wrote speeches and prepared briefings, organized conferences and technical workshops, and managed priorities for the Air Force's Senior Communicator and Deputy Chief Information Officer.

Next she commanded the 86th (later the 435th) Communications Squadron at Ramstein AB, Germany, where she delivered connectivity to deployed warfighters and the Kaiserslautern Military Community and led an upgrade of the satellite communications facility in 2004.

After command, Colonel Tooke served in the Command, Control, Communications, and Computers Systems Directorate of the Joint Staff where she led efforts to operationalize cyberspace and drafted the National Military Strategy for Cyberspace Operations (NMS-CO) in 2006. She also consulted with the Office of the Director for National Intelligence in 2007 to establish the Comprehensive National Cybersecurity Initiative that formalizes relationships among federal agencies and addresses the security of our national cyberspace. In 2008 she teamed with strategy experts in the Strategic Plans and Policy Directorate of the Joint Staff to establish joint cyberspace policy for effective strategic planning and to foster collaboration within the Department of Defense and with federal agency partners, allies, and academia. Responsible for publishing the NMS-CO Implementation Plan, she worked with task leads and experts in the Offices of the Secretary of Defense, the Services, various Agencies, and the Combatant Commands to begin execution of forty-two interrelated tasks.
